Five descriptions must mark the headship of every Christian husband. His headship must be a...

I. Level headship

- A. Compatible with all his personal duties as a Christian
- B. Compatible with all his domestic duties in the home

II.Leading headship

- A. The title is assumed
- B. The practice is necessary
 - 1. Set the pace in the home
 - 2. Establish the priorities in the home
 - 3. Teach the principles in the home
- C. The competence is required

III. Literate headship

- A. Knows the Bible
- B. Knows his wife
- C. Knows himself

IV. Liberating headship

- A. Equips his wife with guidance
- B. Enables his wife with resources
- C. Entrusts his wife with responsibility

V. Loving headship

III.Literate headship

- Literate educated; possessing knowledge
- Literate headship is competent headship because it possesses the knowledge necessary to get the job done
- Without godly wisdom/knowledge, no man can be a competent husband and leader of his home

On competence

Al Mohler: "No leader can be effective without character, but character does not
ensure that a leader is effective. There are many people with sterling character
who are not leaders. A good leader stands out when character is matched by
competence and the central virtue of knowing what to do... Leadership requires
trust in something beyond who the leader is. True credibility rests in the ability of
others to trust what the leader can do. Credibility is not a function of office or
title."1(Emphasis added)

Obstacles to competent leadership:

1. Ignorance

• "If you would be head, remember the head is not only the seat of government, but of knowledge. If you will have the management of the ship, see that a fool is not placed at the helm. Shall the blind offer themselves as guides?" 2— John Angell James

2. Fear (1Sam. 15:24)

• "Doth every big word of proud dust and ashes make thee afraid? Doth the voice of a man make thee tremble? and shall not the voice of God: If thou art of such a fearful and timorous spirit, how is it that thou fearest not to disobey the flat commands of Jesus Christ?... We cannot fear creatures sinfully, till we have forgotten God; did we remember what he is, and what he hath said, we should not be of such feeble spirits: Bring thy heart, then to this dilemma in times of danger; if I let into my heart the slavish fear of man, I must let out the reverential awe and fear of God; and dare I cast off the fear of the Almighty for the frowns of a man?" 3 — John Flavel
