



familial DISCIPLINE

PSALM 119 This was our initial sermon series that lasted from January 2024 to February 2025. It was foundational to the life of our church because the psalm articulates an imminently practical view of the Bible.

THE HOME These 32 lessons from Ephesians 5:18-6:9 were taught in our midweek Bible study and were intended to unify our church around scriptural teaching on men and women's roles in marriage, parenting, and family life. For without orderly homes, the church will largely fail in other ministry endeavors.

FORGIVENESS The second series in our Sunday morning gatherings unpacked the nature and practice of forgiveness. Almost every pastoral counseling case involves forgiveness at some level, and the church cannot last long without a robust understanding of this crucial biblical doctrine.

DISCERNING SCHIZOPHRENIA After receiving an invitation to teach at a local counseling conference on the subject, this eight-part series was the fruit of my study on the complexities of psychosis, or what is more popularly known by its mental health moniker — schizophrenia. A glossary of terms associated with the schizophrenia construct with brief explanations of their significance to the Christian worldview can be found here.

SPIRITUAL WARFARE This series is an exposition of the classic section on the armor of God from Ephesians 6:10-20. It details the nature, importance, and methods associated with God's weaponry for the Christian's victory over spiritual forces.

FIRST JOHN We began this Sunday morning series in May 2025. The apostle John wrote this letter so that those who believe might confidently join him and the other apostles in confident fellowship with the triune God.

OUR NED



In his classic work, *The Christian in Complete Armour*, Puritan pastor William Gurnall (1616-1679) described God's tendency to provide for his people only after their situation became desperate, because such wise operations magnify God's power most. "God lays the scene of his providence so, that when he hath done, it may be said almighty power was here." Gurnall wrote. For several years now, this principle has fueled my prayers for New Orleans. I have regularly asked God to establish his church in New Orleans East in such a way that would be impossible without his working, to make it clear to all that this was his doing.

By removing certain means of past ministry provision, the Lord seems to be using this season of neediness to demonstrate his power and sufficiency toward us. Furthermore, by every earthly metric, this church plant should not endure. We have no denominational backing, are located where the city and state's population has trended downward², are in a segment of the city with a dying economy and where violent crime and poverty are commonplace. Our success is obviously entirely in God's hands—what a great place for us to be!

As we eagerly anticipate how God might work, would you please consider being the means by which he provides?

Therefore, since my (Omri's) compensation (salary + benefits) makes up the greatest portion of our expenses, I would seek to reduce our spending by finding additional work.
